TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Plaintiff Alan Atkinson filed an Application for Temporary Restraining Order and gave notice to Defendant prior to the hearing. Having considered Plaintiff's application, the Court finds that Plaintiff has demonstrated a probable right to relief based on the Texas Open Meetings Act, that Plaintiff has suffered a probable injury through denial of access and participation in government decisionmaking, that the harm to Plaintiff is imminent because Defendant is acting or about to act on the resolutions at issue, and that the harm to Plaintiff is irreparable and without adequate remedy at law because it cannot be remedied by monetary damages. Plaintiff's Application for Temporary Restraining Order is GRANTED as follows.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that HHA, its officers, directors, commissioners, board members and all other persons or entities acting by it, through it, on its behalf, or with its authority are enjoined and prohibited from taking any further action on or pursuant to Resolution No. 3063, Resolution No. 3074, Resolution No. 3076, Resolution No. 3101, Resolution No. 3113, Resolution

No. 3114, and Resolution No. 3115, and from taking any further action on or pursuant to any subsequent resolutions for which any of the foregoing resolutions and acts taken pursuant to the foregoing resolutions were a prerequisite. *Notwithstanding the foregoing, this order is not intended to prohibit or enjoin HHA from taking any actions to ratify or cure any alleged Texas Open Meetings Act violations with respect to the foregoing resolutions.*

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT Plaintiff's Application for Temporary Injunction shall be heard before December 5, 2019 in the 61 Judicial District Court of Harris


